STEM Our wonderful journey exploring the Digital Technology world of coding is continuing in the STEM room. Students across all levels are having a great time learning how to direct objects using a range of commands - the juniors using arrows and directions, the middle school using directive words such as forward and east, and the seniors using more formal coding commands.
