Dear Parents and Carers.

October has been such a busy month already with students participating in a range of opportunities. Providing extra-curricular opportunities for our students is so important for their skill development as well as building confidence and engagement.

Year 5 Leadership Sessions:

Our Year 5s have been immersed in a range of leadership skills and tasks to build their capacity in preparation for next year. Team building, taking initiative and reflecting on their own strengths and areas for improvement have been a main focus. We certainly have some students who have displayed responsibility and commitment to these sessions!

Year 6 Transition Sessions:

The Year 6s have a weekly session with the Smith Family Treanisiton group to support them in moving into secondary school. They discuss their fears and things they are excited about as well as looking at what a typical day in secondary school could look like. They also had some secondary student visit to answer their questions and explain what secondary school is like.

Other School Events

We have planned many exciting events for our students and school community. Some of these events are student-led and aim to raise money for the school whilst others are more about promoting awareness and sense of community. Keep an eye out for the information regarding each of these events.

Term 4 Priorities

Our priorities this term has continued to be a strong focus on numbers and algebra as well as introducing the Reading and Spelling program Nessy. Students in Years 3-6 are engaged in Nessy every day and it's been great to see students utilising the program at home too. This program is targeted at the students' needs and is very engaging and helps the development of their Literacy skills. Another main priority has been embedding our Behaviour Management Process to ensure there is a consistent approach for everyone. Utilising our learning from Berry Street, we are strengthening our culture and continuing to have high expectations of our students and how they behave. Lateness

The teaching staff has raised some concern that many students are arriving late for school on a fairly regular basis. Unfortunately this is a situation that can have a negative effect on the education of not only those students who are late, but also the other students in the class.

What impact does being late have on the student?

Students who are late miss a lot of instructions and information about what is happening, not to mention important learning sessions. This means that they have to catch up somehow. Students also miss out on catching up with their friends in the playground before school. Students can feel unsettled, disorganized and unhappy for the rest of the day and it can take them some time to complete and understand the work that they have missed. It's similar to being late to see a movie and not being able to understand what's happening because you have missed out on who the characters are and what the plot is.

How does it affect the other students in the class?

Students who are late have an unsettling effect on the rest of the class. Because not all late students arrive at once, the interruptions go on until the last student is settled. Students who are late often have things that need to be done prior to them joining the class and this causes even more disruption. Sometimes other students have to wait to get the teachers attention and important issues can be forgotten.

Why does student lateness cause difficulties for the teacher?

The teacher has a certain amount of material and activities to cover each lesson. Also, organizational issues are usually dealt with at the beginning of the day. Teachers can become increasingly frustrated when late students continually and repeatedly interrupt their planned routines, as they have to stop teaching to deal with the issues involved.

We are all human. Cars can break down and unexpected situations can occur. We know that family morning routines are not always straightforward. If you are experiencing problems, speak to us, as we may be able to offer suggestions to help.

We are happy to accept that students will be late on the odd occasion because of unforeseen circumstances. However, arriving late on a regular basis is not acceptable

A student who is half an hour late each day misses the equivalent of 16.6 days of learning each year.

Sunsmart - Sun safety is a shared responsibility. We do have a limited supply of sunscreen so we suggest children bring along their own that suits their skin – as long as it is SPF30 or higher, broad-spectrum and water-resistant. They could try a clip on and hang it on their school bag for easy storage, as well as being a visual reminder. Please refer to our SunSmart Policy on our website.

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At Ballam Park Primary School, we provide learning opportunities for our students both academically, socially, and emotionally. We value diversity and teach our children a range of skills and attributes to help promote international mindedness and inclusion. The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships is a program that supports our students in understanding the appropriate way to treat people and ways to seek help and problem solve.

Recently we've been made aware of some concerning behaviours by some of our students that have involved saying and doing things that are considered racist or prejudiced (both in the playground and before school). Children come to school to learn a range of skills including how to be kind and inclusive and we understand that sometimes they make mistakes or don't realise the impact of their behaviour. However, some of these actions have been quite deliberate and targeted. These situations have been dealt with, but we are requesting, as a school community, that we all come together to ensure all our children are acting in an inclusive manner.

To educate our students and to support their development and understanding of inclusivity, we have implemented and will further develop programs such as:

- Year level focus on inclusion utilising the Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships program
- Discussions and learning focusing on diversity
- Ongoing support and education for all students

We ask that you, as a family, have these discussions at home too. Consistent messages at school and home will help support our children in making good decisions and knowing how to speak to people. 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
