This term our Foundation students have been learning the letters m, s, f, a, p, t, c and i.

They have been learning about the sounds these letters make, how to write them and making words with them. They've been learning that 'having a go' when writing is really important, even if they think they can't write yet.

Year 1s and 2s have been learning different blends (2 letters that blend together) and digraphs (2 letters that make one sound).

The Yr 1s have been doing lots of word, phrase and sentence writing. The Yr 2s have been doing LOADS of procedural writing about the cooking they've done.

CONGRATULATIONS to the students who have read at home for over 30 nights this term. Some students have even read over 50 nights!!!

### Foundation & Year 1

In PE lessons, Foundation and Year 1 students have practised following rules and safety. Students have participated in simple games and activities designed to develop their basic movement patterns and fundamental motor skills. 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
















### **Sport Clinics- Year 3-6**

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### Foundation & Year 1

In Visual Art lessons, Foundation and Year 1 students have explored various techniques to mark different lines, shapes and patterns to create drawings. Using oil pastels, students applied these techniques to produce a Self Portrait' and a 'Fish collage' which incorporated lines, shapes, colours and a background with patterns. Students have also practised their fine motor skills learning to cut and use scissors correctly.



### <u>Year 2/3</u>

Students learned about French painter, sculptor and printmaker, Henri Matisse.Using his artwork as inspiration, students designed and produced their own colourful artwork using paper to create a collage of geometric and organic shapes. Students are currently exploring with charcoal and using techniques such as blending and shading to create artwork drawings of pandas.

### <u>Year 4/5</u>

Students were introduced to an artist from the Netherlands, Piet Mondrian. Students studied his realistic paintings as well as his abstract paintings made from squares and rectangles and using the primary colours.

Students sketched a set of stacked teacups and using rulers to form squares and rectangles, students coloured their teacup designs using the primary colours to create their own artwork inspired by Piet Mondrian.







### Year 5/6

Students learned about a Spanish painter, sculptor, printmaker, ceramicist and theatre designer, Pablo Picasso. Students explored Picasso's cubism period, a style of art which shows all angles of a person or an object all at once.



Using lines, shapes and colour, students created their version of a portrait inspired by Picasso's cubism. Students are currently exploring with charcoal and using techniques such as blending and shading to create penguin artworks.









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
**SPECIALIST SPOTLIGHT –** What's been happening in.....





This term all students have started to learn about Japanese culture and language, as well as understanding the expectations of the Japanese room. Students have now mastered the skill of counting in Japanese. Most students can now count to 10 if not higher in Japanese and a lot of students also know how to write each number in kanji. Students have enjoyed singing songs, playing games and completing activities to practise this skill.

Students have been learning how to have a basic conversion in Japanese including Konnichiwa (Hello), sayounara (goodbye), arigatou gozaimasu (thank you) and o genki desu ka? (how are you?)

Students have also enjoyed learning the names of colours, and doing Japanese craft activities including making sakuras, lanterns, koinobori, and origami.



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
