Occupational Therapists in school - TERM 3

I'm very excited to announce that we have partnered with Noah's Ark Inc. and Monash University and will have two Occupational Therapy Students working with our students for all of Term 3.

Occupational Therapists can support students with a range of areas including development of fine motor skills (e.g. drawing, writing, cutting), self-care skills (e.g. dressing, shoe-laces, toileting), regulation, play & social skills; as well as supporting students to participate & engage in their learning.

The OT students will work alongside teachers to provide whole classroom strategies, as well as with students within the classroom, and may also work with small groups and individuals. They will be supervised by Brianna Smith, Occupational Therapist from Noah's Ark who will oversee their practice and be on site approximately 1 full day per week.


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Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2

Winter Interschool Sport

Students have participated in sports such as netball, soccer and AFL football for Winter Inter-school sport Formal rules, tactical strategies, good sportsmanship, fair play and having fun have been encouraged to develop students' personal and social skills. Thank you to the Year 3 and 4 students who are playing extremely well with the Year 5/6 students in these sports!



AFL sessions Students are currently participating in a four week AFL program learning a variety of fundamental and advanced gross motor skills from kicking, handballing, marking, running, jumping and evading. Great to see smiles and students having fun learning and supporting one another.



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Students studied the life and work of the artist Kandinsky. Using his work as inspiration, students applied their understanding of concentric circles, warm colours and pattern to create their own artwork.

Students learned about the meaning of ANZAC day and poppies. Using soft chalk pastels students practised techniques such as blending and layering to create beautiful artworks of poppies.









Year 2/3 Students analysed and discussed man made products produced using various materials and weaving. Students learned how to create their own weaving loom and strengthened their fine motor skills and understanding of over and under techniques when weaving with wool.

3A Students studied the works and sculptures of the artist Alberto Giacometti as an introduction to 'form' in art. Students developed an understanding of 3D form and material manipulation when creating artwork of human action figures using aluminum foil.

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Year 4/5

Students were introduced to the art element of form and papier mache techniques for creating three-dimensional objects such as sculptures. Students studied Grecian vases analysing shape, colours and patterns. Experimenting with construction materials such as cardboard, balloons and paper cups, students have been working on producing a 3D papier mache sculpture of a Grecian vase which will be decorated with colour, lines, shapes and patterns.









Year 5/6

Students discussed the meaning of ANZAC day and the significance of poppies. Using watercolour paints, students experimented with the ratio of water to pigment learning to control the tone and value used in their painting of poppies in a field.

Students were introduced to the principle of form in art and explored basic techniques to roll and manipulate clay into various shapes. Using a ball of clay, students learned the correct pinch technique to create the correct wall thickness and smoothness when forming a pinch pot. Students used the slip technique to smooth out their clay and used various tools to create patterns and texture to decorate their pinch pot.







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Japanese

At the start of Term 2, students were lucky enough to have Aiko come and perform for them. She performed two shows, one for Foundation to Year 4 and one for Year 5 to 6.

In the Foundation to Year 4 students, students enjoyed dressing up in costumes, listening to a Japanese story and learning a dance using fans.

In the Year 5 and 6 performance students learnt about Samurais and Ninjas. They enjoyed playing different games and throwing shuriken.













This term students have learned how to say different body parts in Japanese, with some students knowing how to sing 'Head, shoulders, knees and toes,' in Japanese.

Students also applied their knowledge of different Japanese phrases to create a comic strip.



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This term in library students were lucky enough to have Stig Wemyss come and perform for them as part of an incursion organised by the Frankston Library. He had students laughing and captivated as he talked about his role as an audio reader, of such books as the Treehouse series. Some students were lucky enough to be given prizes and a number of students got Frankston Library membership cards.











This term in library students have started to learn about the Dewey system and enjoyed creating sloths after listening to the story 'Speedy Sloth.'
